

Greetings from our Executive Principal

Dear Parents and Carers, Welcome to another edition of the Springwell Leeds newsletter, in which you will see excerpts from the latest month in the life of our Academy.

We have had another exceptionally busy month at Springwell Leeds, with the highlight, of course, being the opening of our first new build site at Seacroft in the East of the city. The Christmas and New Year period was an even busier than usual time for us as the team here beavered away behind the scenes to ensure that everything was ready for the children arriving in January. This involved an enormous team effort from people who, as parents and carers, you are not likely to meet or hear from if you visit the Academy.

Our Estates manager, Stephen Boldy and the site team, Graham and Jordan were probably the hardest working people around ensuring that the finishing touches had been made to the building and that the builders. Interserve and other contractors, had finished everything they needed to finish. We also had a huge team of cleaners in after the builders to ensure that everything was shiny and spotless for when the children arrived. Stephen and his team and the cleaners did an amazing job and our thanks should go to all of them. Springwell Leeds East has now been up and running for a few weeks and the transition of children from our other sites has continued at a steady pace this month. We recognise how difficult change and transition can be for our young people, particularly where that transition is to such a completely different environment from one to which they have been used. Shona Crichton's team at East worked really hard with staff from across all the sites to make this process as smooth as possible and they will continue to do this until all our children that are moving to East are in and settled.

I wrote to all parents of children at Burley Park last week to confirm that we were closing that site from the Easter holidays this year. Our plan had always been to move our students to the new buildings as soon as possible, whilst making sure that proper transition arrangements are in place to support them in ensuring that the move is as smooth as possible. Our initial plan was to keep all students at Burley Park until the end of this academic year (July 2018) however, having considered the opportunities that our two new buildings present for our young people, I decided to close the Burley Park site at the end of this term and move children to either the new East site or the new South site. Our Governors agreed this. We will be contacting all parents/carers individually to discuss the arrangements for transition over the next few weeks. Our aim is to ensure that parents, carers and children are properly supported through this process so that they can settle quickly in to their fantastic new schools. You will be reassured to know that many of the staff from the



Burley Park site will be moving with the children to the new site, which will help smooth the transition. We are of course also closing the Stonegate Road site at the same time and Paul Carney and his team will be working equally hard with parents, carers and students to ensure that process is a success for all involved. The new building in South Leeds is still on track for opening and you can see the progress of the both that site and the site in North Leeds here,





As you can see we also enjoyed eating them.









Julia Preston Springwell Governor and CEO at GIPSIL

I joined the Springwell Governing Body as I have a keen interest in helping children and young people in Leeds be the best that they possibly can be regardless of their circumstances.

I've been working in Leeds for the last 17 years, managing and developing services and homeless schemes mainly for young people; for example, GIPSIL provides housing and support for young people leaving care and we work in mainstream schools across Leeds providing emotional wellbeing services.

I enjoy motorcycling and have toured most of Western Europe on various biking holidays with friends. I'm a newish grandma and love spending lots of time with my granddaughter and family. I didn't get many qualifications at school as I'm dyslexic and struggled with English so on leaving school I chose a practical but exciting job where I had to think on my feet and worked for 7 years as an emergency ambulance woman. I had two children and changed career when they were babies as organising child care was difficult when working shifts. I did part time care work for a while and trained as a counsellor, specialising in helping young people in psychological crisis.

My kids started school and I started a new career as a support worker, working with people experiencing mental health issues and homelessness before going into management and working my way up to become the CEO at GIPSIL, a local organisation founded by residents in Gipton. I bring my own learning to the board from very varied life and work experiences to help children and young people in an increasingly challenging world and I'm living proof that you don't need the best start in life or a degree to get on; and that a "can do" attitude and determination is more important. I've always been motivated by roles where I've made a lasting positive difference to others and hope I can continue to help Springwell going forward.
