As we know, Teamtime is an important session within our curriculum, giving pupils opportunity to focus on SEMH development each day and a fantastic time for staff to continue building positive relationships with pupils. This is also a great opportunity for interaction with pupils and staff outside of their own class/ year group.

The effort that our staff members go to, to help give our pupils positive experiences at the end of each day, is outstanding. Over the last term we have seen some fantastic Team Time groups engaging our pupils and showing great examples of working together with both pupils and staff taking part in various clubs including; Taskmaster, Film Club, Football, Sign Language, DJ Sessions and KS4 mentoring our younger pupils in snake care.


