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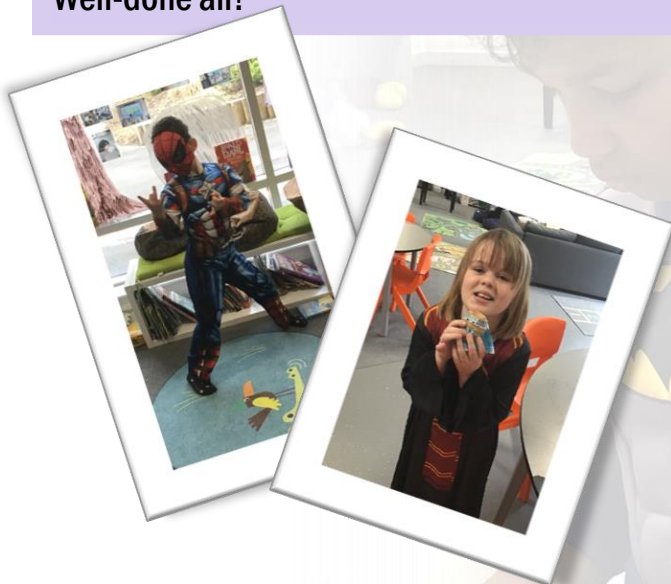
# Primary

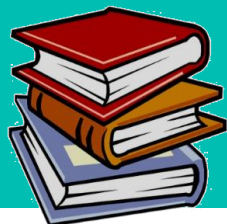

# East Site

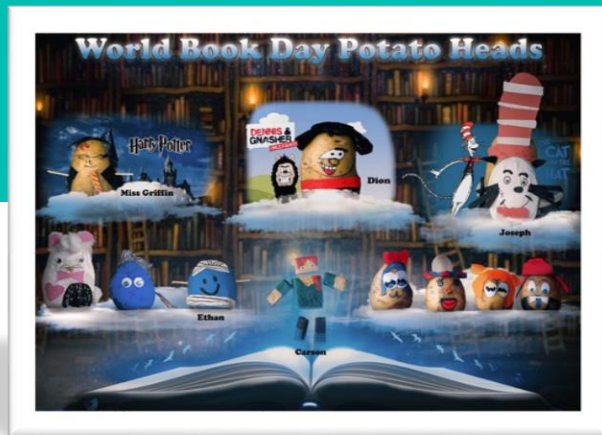


## Operation Mineral

This quote from a study of students at Washington State University shows the healing power of animals: "*Students in our study that interacted with cats and dogs had a significant reduction in cortisol, a major stress hormone.*" We also know of the positive experiences of using school dogs at our other sites, so we were keen to get involved and share the benefits. We have been blown away with the positive impact that our dogs' presence is already having.

Chewie is our oldest school dog. Although he is still only 14 months old, his training has been going really well and he has been able to increase his time in school and amongst the pupils and staff. Some of the work he has carried out includes: facilitating restorative meetings; meeting and greeting nervous new pupils; being read to by reluctant readers; giving cuddles to pupils and staff who have had to sit with some big emotions this half term, and being a friendly face at morning arrival time. He is ALWAYS happy, and never judges, whatever he is doing.
