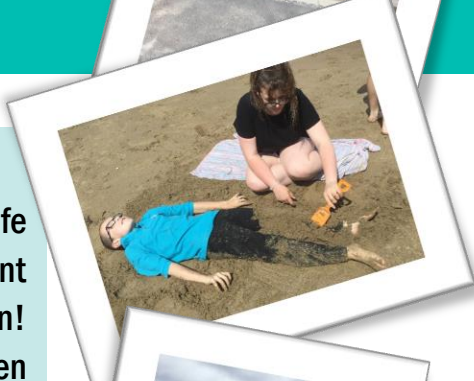

This half-term in Primary at South, we have been working on our reading areas making more cosy spaces to enjoy sharing a fabulous story. Just take a look!

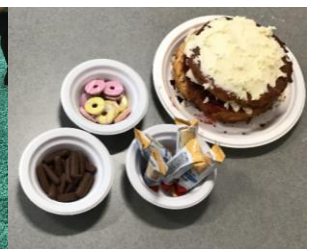
South's cosy reading areas

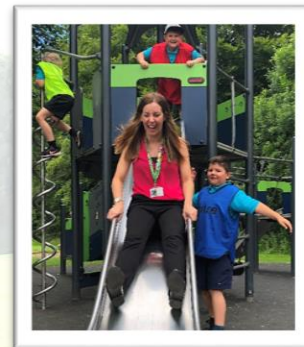


South Site



Outdoor Learning

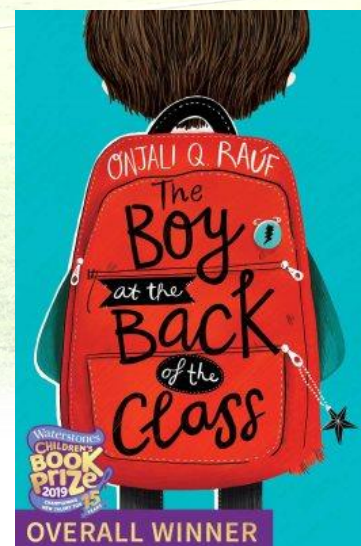

Our Staff Book Club

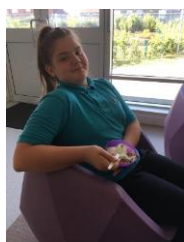

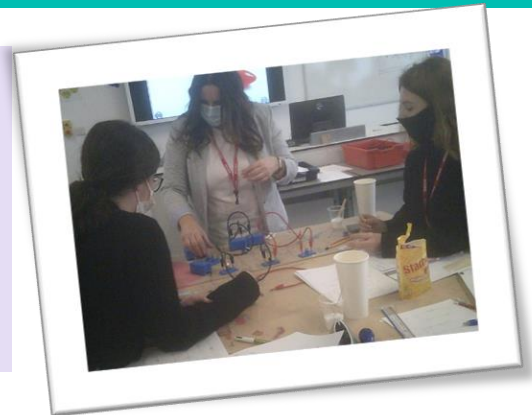
Sporting Success
